SUNNY XIA Conductor

San Diego Symphony Conducting Fellow

Recognized for her innate musicality, compelling presence, and technical precision, conductor Sunny Xuecong Xia's ability to forge an immediate and captivating connection with orchestras and singers alike has led to engagements around the globe.

Xia holds a dual master's degree in Conducting and Violin
Performance from the Cleveland Institute of Music and a doctoral
degree from Arizona State University. At the Seattle Symphony, she is
mentored by Ludovic Morlot and Xian Zhang. For three summers, she
attended the Monteux School and Music Festival as a Kurt & Torj Wray
Conducting Scholar. An accomplished violinist, she performed as a soloist
with orchestras in China and Australia, including the symphony orchestras of
Harbin, Zheijiang, Hunan and Guangxi, and the Concertante Ensemble.

Originally from Guangzhou, China, Xia relocated to Sydney, Australia at the age of 14 on a scholarship from the Australian String Academy that allowed her to further her violin

studies with Peter Shi-xiang Zhang and Charmian Gadd. A talented basketball athlete, she competed in the New South Wales Metro Junior League before focusing primarily on her musical pursuits. When not performing or enjoying a pick-up game, she can be found reading, hiking, or learning languages. She speaks Cantonese, English, Mandarin, and Teochew, and is improving upon her French, German, and Italian.

WHAT YOU'LL HEAR TODAY

John Williams: "Hedwig's Theme" from Harry Potter and the Sorcerer's Stone

Hedwig isn't just Harry Potter's snowy owl—she's also his loyal companion who delivers letters and guides him through the wizarding world. John Williams gave Hedwig her very own theme: mysterious at the start, with silvery notes on the celesta that sound like moonlight on wings. Then, the music soars with strings and brass, as if Hedwig is gliding high above Hogwarts. Listen for the way the music captures her wisdom, her magic, and her flight.

Anna Clyne: Masquerade

Anna Clyne wrote this piece for a giant outdoor festival in London, filled with masks, dancing, and dazzling surprises—like a musical costume party. The music rushes forward with swirling rhythms and sudden changes, almost like turning a corner at Halloween and bumping into someone in disguise! There are moments that sound sneaky, followed by bursts that feel like fireworks. You can imagine parades of masked characters—fun, mysterious, and a little mischievous.

Camille Saint-Saëns: Dance macabre

Every year on Halloween night, Death plays his violin at midnight, and the skeletons climb out of their graves to dance. The xylophone clacks like rattling bones, while the strings whirl in dizzy circles. As the music speeds up, you can almost see the skeletons spinning faster and faster—until the rooster crows at dawn, and they all vanish back into the ground.

Igor Stravinsky: The Firebird Suite (1919 version)

Stravinsky's Firebird comes from a ballet, where dancers tell a fairy tale with their movements. A brave prince wanders into a magical garden guarded by the glowing Firebird. When he captures her, she offers him help in exchange for her freedom. Later, he faces an evil sorcerer and his army of monsters. With the Firebird's power, the prince breaks the spell and rescues a princess. Stravinsky's music paints it all: shimmering flutes for the Firebird's wings, wild dances for the monsters, and at the very end, one of the most glorious, blazing finales in all of music—like the Firebird rising in triumph.
